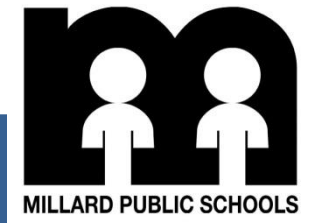

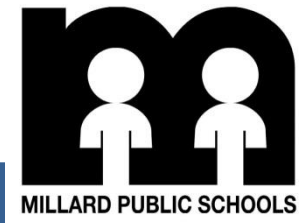

- Pursue an advanced degree or enter the workforce earlier



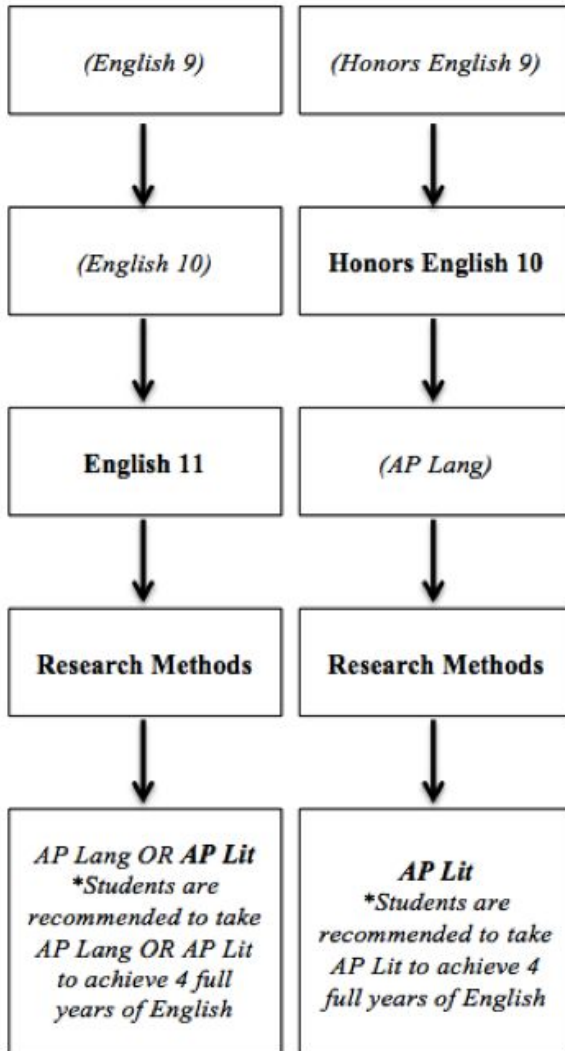
Who can apply?

- Any student who will be entering 9th grade in 2019-2020.
- Students not currently attending Millard South must complete a Within District Transfer Request Form to attend MSHS by February 15
- Students not currently in the Millard District must complete paperwork by March 15
- Students not in the MSHS attendance area must be approved for transfer or open enrollment to participate in ECHS.

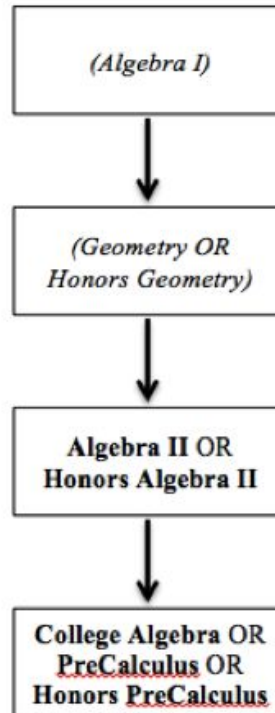

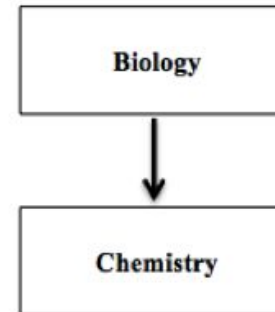

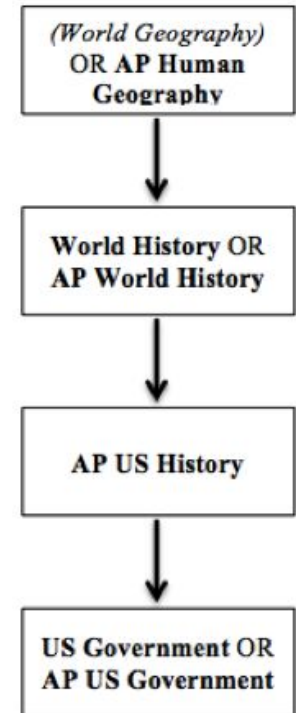

What will Early College cost?

- Early College dual enrollment tuition baseline at Metropolitan Community College is \$36.00 per course for 2019-2020.
- The Millard Public Schools Foundation pays 50% of the reduced rate tuition. This scholarship is renewable by earning a B average on dual-enrolled courses each semester.
- Tuition is paid to Metropolitan Community College at the beginning of each semester.

Scholarship Opportunities

- In addition to the scholarship provided by Millard Public Schools Foundation, another scholarship is available for families that meet the financial aid criteria.
- The Access College Early Scholarship (ACE), funded by the State of Nebraska, provides additional assistance to students whose family qualifies for Free/Reduced Lunch.
- High school counselors can provide information for students who wish to apply.

To apply







- Complete an application
 - Available on the Early College website
 - Due by January 18
- Acceptance letters mailed the week of Feb. 4
- Register for Early College courses

Students who are not currently assigned to Millard South will need to submit a Within District Transfer Request Form by February 15. **Students must be granted a transfer in order to be in the Early College Program.**
